

The April webinar relates to each content area as well as the NHE current environmental issue: Roots and Resiliency: Fostering Forest Stewardship in a Canopy of Change



Lesson Objective:

Students will enact a model forest assessment session at a town meeting where they work with varied groups of people with different goals and values to agree upon the best forest management decisions that best represent the imaginary town of Granite Cliff, NH.

- Forest assessment with inventory
- Impact of forest property threats/vulnerability
- Forest management strategy options with pros and cons
- What policy procedures should the town adopt to ensure that the agreed upon choice is carried out?

Each student will log on to the shared zoom link by 3:00.

- o Students will be randomly assigned an "identity" to role-play.
- Students will lead and run the discussions, keeping in their assigned characters, to reach their goals by following prompts.
- Students can work from home or at school.
- Teachers are not required to attend, but may choose to log on as silent observers or let students participate without them.

The webinar will end at 4:15.

Note- The scope of the webinar is large and complex. Do not worry! The goals are to get an overview of ideas, vocabulary, and content; to work collaboratively; to explore information from various viewpoints; and to share what was chosen by consensus with "your town". The exploration of topics within the webinar lesson will help you prepare for each area of the NH Envirothon competition. You can explore it in further detail with your teams and on your own after the webinar.
